1. Name the attraction outside Dumfries that Robert Burns visited in 1796 to try and "cure" his rheumatic fever? (**Brow Well.**)
2. Which World Championships are usually held in Palnackie? (**Flounder tramping**)
3. Which castle in Dumfries and Galloway is home to works by Rembrandt and da Vinci? (**Drumlanrig Castle.** The da Vinci was stolen in 2003 and returned in 2007)
4. Famous for eloping couples, how old did boys have to be to get married in Gretna during the 18th century? (**14.** 12 for girls)
5. In what year was construction on the River Nith Suspension Bridge finished: A)1875, B)1905, C)1925? (**A)1875.**)
6. Which museum in the region commemorates cordite production during World War 1? (**Devil's Porridge.**)
7. Who designed the "Garden of Cosmic Speculation" and the "Crawick Multiverse"? (**Charles Jencks.**)
8. Which Royal Burgh in the region is famous for its knitted glove design? (**Sanquar.**)
9. In what year was the Wigtown Book Festival first launched? (**1999=2pts 1990s=1pt.**)
10. Which came first from J.M. Barrie, the Peter Pan play or Peter Pan novel? (**Play.** 1904, novel in 1911)

Round 2 - ENTERTAINMENT (FILM & TV)

1. In 'The Lion King', what type of animal is Timon? (**Meerkat.**)
2. In what decade was the TV show 'Allo Allo!' first aired? (**1980s.** 1982-1992)
3. As in the title of the 1946 film noir, who "always rings twice"? (**The Postman.**)
4. In which 1974 OSCAR winning crime film would you find the line 'keep your friends close, but your enemies closer.'? (**The Godfather Part 2.**)
5. In which superhero film would you find the villain 'Kill-monger'? (**Black Panther.**)
6. What cinema format is characterised by 70mm film, a tall aspect ratio and stadium seating? (**IMAX.** First developed in the late 1960s in Canada.)
7. In what year was 'Groundhog Day' released? (**1993=2pts, 1990s=1pt.**)
8. What Disney film, based on a Brothers Grimm fairy tale, is the most expensive animated film of all time? (**Tangled.** Budget of \$260 Million, 11th on the all-time list. Not including inflation)
9. True or False; All Disney Princess's have been right handed? (**FALSE.** 2 have been left handed; Mulan and Tiana from 'The Princess and the Frog')
10. Since the year 2000, how many Best Picture Academy Award winning films have had one word titles? (**8=2pts, 5-11=1pt.** Gladiator, Chicago, Crash, Argo, Spotlight, Moonlight, Parasite, Nomadland)

Round 3 - FOOD & DRINK

1. True or False: Cinnamon grows under the ground? (**FALSE.** It's the inner bark from a tree)
2. Name the French dessert that derives its name from the French word for 'to blow'? (**Soufflé.**)
3. World War 2 propaganda stated that what common vegetable would help you see better in the dark? (**Carrots.** This myth was taken from 'carrots are good for eye health' which is true.)
4. What type of meat is used to make bulgogi, a grilled Korean dish? (**Beef.** literally means "fire meat")
5. Name the British relish that contains cauliflower, onion, gherkin, mustard and turmeric? (**Piccalilli.**)
6. The American State of Georgia is famous for what fruit? (**Peach.**)
7. Which sweet came with the slogan 'Don't tap it... Whack it!?' (**Terry's Chocolate Orange.** Made famous by Dawn French)
8. What plant, grown in bogs, is commonly harvested by flooding its vines and having the fruit float to the surface? (**Cranberry.** Dry picking accounts for only about 5-10% of production)
9. Named after a bird, which is the most popular beer drunk in India? (**Kingfisher.** Market share of over 36% in India)
10. Which sauce is made from cayenne pepper, hot sauce and melted butter? (**Buffalo Sauce.**)

Round 4 - GENERAL KNOWLEDGE

1. What is the name of the American version of the BBC show 'Strictly Come Dancing'? (**Dancing with the Stars.** Despite debuting a year after 'Strictly', the American version has already done 27 series, or 11 more than the British version.)
2. In Harry Potter, which house values intelligence, creativity, learning, and wit? (**Ravenclaw.**)
3. In terms of types of cameras, what does SLR stand for? (Single-lens reflex.)
4. In feet, what length of steel was the original 'Slinky' made from: A)40ft B)60ft C)80ft? (**(C)80ft.**)
5. In Roman Numerals, what value is L? (**50.**)
6. What is the only country to have won a gold medal at every Winter Olympics? (**USA.** Only 6 countries have won medals at every Summer Olympic games, and 12 sent athletes to every Summer Olympic games. Norway won gold at every Winter Olympics apart from '88.)
7. The 'Americas Cup' is a trophy awarded in which sport? (**Sailing.** The oldest international sporting trophy)
8. True or False: Etymology is the study of insects? (**FALSE.** Etymology is the study of the origins of words. Entomology is the study of insects)
9. Who wrote novels such as 'The Handmaid's Tale', 'Cats Eye' and 'Surfacing'? (**Margaret Atwood.**)
10. Greek Feta cheese is made with at least 70% of which animal's milk? (**Sheep.** Can have up to 30% of goat's milk in it as well)
